Why study at Queen Mary?

Campus life

Queen Mary is a campus-based university, combining access to central London with the ease of having all student services in one main location. Accommodation is available both on the Mile End campus in East London, where most of our students are based, and in the local area.

Employability

Queen Mary graduates are highly sought after by employers and have some of the highest starting salaries of any UK university. Our careers office provides careers appointments, opportunities to meet employers and access to a live database of work experience opportunities and job vacancies.

Study in London

London is the cultural, artistic, and economic centre of the UK. And East London, where our largest campus lives, is one of the most dynamic parts of the city. Studying here gives you the chance

to explore London's amazing sights, as well as make the most of the many opportunities to get ahead when it comes to your career, in a location close to some of the world's leading employers.

Partnership details

Queen Mary participating schools

School of Economics and Finance(SEF), School of Business and Management (SBM), School of Politics and International Relations (SPIR), Centre for Commercial Law Studies (CCLS), School of the Arts(STA), School of History (SoH).

RUC participating schools

School of Public Administration and Policy (SPAP), School of Finance (SF), School of Liberal Arts (SLA).

3+1+1: Three years at RUC and one semester/academic year at Queen Mary. Return to Queen Mary for masters degree

Students from RUC SPAP need a minimum GPA of 3.0 out of 4.0. The study abroad programme is open to all subject areas within the Queen Mary schools listed above. If you are doing a masters you need a minimum grade of 75 (UK 2.1 equivalent) or 70 (UK 2.2 equivalent) in your bachelors from RUC.

1+1/1+1+1: Year one at RUC, year two at Queen Mary and then back to RUC for year three

Students need the equivalent of a 2.1 or 2.2 bachelors degree award from a recognised university and a grade of 75 or 70 from RUC masters and to meet any other entry requirements for the programme.

4+1: Students who have completed a bachelors degree at RUC can apply to study a masters at Queen Mary

Students need a minimum grade of 75 or 70 in their bachelors degree from RUC and to meet any other entry requirements for the programme.



English language requirements

Most Schools require either Band 4 (IELTS 6.5 overall with at least 6.0 in each sub-test) or Band 5 (IELTS 7.0 overall with at least 6.0 in each sub-test). All law postgraduate programmes require IELTS 7.0 overall with 7.0 in Writing. The Study Abroad programme requires Band 5. Pre-sessional English

If you do not meet the English language requirements for direct entry onto the programme, you can take a pre-sessional English language course with us before your programme starts. You can apply via the admissions team and you will then be given an unconditional offer for the English language course.

Finances

Tuition fees for RUC students

Some Queen Mary Schools (SED, SLLF, SoH, SEF and SPIR) offer a 20% partnership scholarship on tuition fees; while other Queen Mary schools (CCLS and SBM) offer a 10% partnership scholarship. Tuition fees are listed on the programme pages of our website. There may be other scholarships available depending on the programme, but it is not possible to combine with the 10% or 20% partnership scholarship.

Living in London

The total cost of life in London (including housing, food and travel) will be roughly £1,334 per month. Residential fees for 2025/26 will be announced in early 2025. For reference, in 2024/25, fees were £181 to £320 per week.

Work in the UK after you graduate

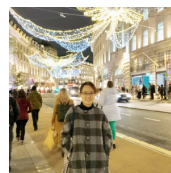
The Graduate Immigration Route enables students to work in the UK for two years after graduating from Queen Mary.

Applying to Queen Mary

1

Complete your application by Friday 30 May 2025

3+1+1 applicants: qmul.ac.uk/international/international-students/studyabroad/apply
4+1 and 1+1/1+1+1 applicants: qmul.ac.uk/international/partnerships/application

Create your log-in details, and upload the following documents:

- A scan of your passport
- One academic reference
- Your most recent transcript(s) and bachelor degree certificate. Postgraduate applicants must provide both bachelor and masters transcripts
- Bachelor graduation certificate
- Evidence of English language such as IELTS (or other accepted English language test)

(We don't need a Personal Statement or CV but a school may ask for this at a later stage).

2

Receive your conditional offer

If you don't meet all the entry requirements straight away, you will receive a conditional offer from our admissions team, and you will be invited to accept your offer.

3

Apply for housing

After you accept your offer, you will be directed to apply for your housing. You will receive an email from our housing services team.

4

Receive your unconditional offer

Email your updated documents (as outlined in your conditional offer) such as final transcript or English language results as soon as you have them. As long as you meet the requirements of your conditional offer, you will be given an unconditional offer.

5

Apply for your CAS number

Information about applying for your CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance for Study) will be included in your unconditional offer. You must include details of your CAS number in your visa application.

6

Apply for your visa

The visa application process can be complicated. Luckily we have lots of advice available through the Queen Mary Advice and Counselling Service: welfare.qmul.ac.uk/international. Make sure you apply as soon as possible!

7

Get excited and prepare for your arrival
